

KAY COUNTY STANDARD VISITATION SCHEDULE

REGULAR VISITATION

A. The non-custodial parent shall have visitation with the minor child(ren) every other weekend from 6:00 p.m. on Friday to 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.

B. Weekend visitation on holidays not listed on the Holiday Visitation Schedule and which include a Federal or State Monday Holiday shall extend to 6:00 p.m. on Monday.

C. Regular weekend visitation shall not occur during summer visitation.

HOLIDAY VISITATION

All holiday visitation shall begin at 6:00 p.m. the first day of visitation and shall end at 6:00 p.m. on the last day of visitation unless specifically stated below:

Child's Birthday (8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Visitation shall not interfere with school. If child's birthday falls on a defined holiday, the holiday visitation shall take precedence)	Custodial Parent	Non-Custodial Parent

The holiday visitation shall take precedence over all regularly scheduled visitation, meaning that the non-custodial parent's every other weekend visitation is eliminated when it otherwise would fall on one of the custodial parent's holidays.

The holiday visitation schedule for Spring Break and Christmas shall be governed by the school the child attends or would attend, if not of school age. If child is out of school on the Friday prior to the start of a holiday visitation, then visitation shall begin after school is out on Thursday at 6:00 p.m.

MOTHER'S DAY AND FATHER'S DAY

The natural mother shall have visitation with the minor child(ren) for the entire weekend of Mother's Day from 6:00 p.m. on Friday to 6:00 p.m. on Sunday. The natural father shall have visitation with the minor child(ren) for the entire weekend of Father's Day from 6:00 p.m. on Friday to 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.

SUMMER VISITATION

The non-custodial parent shall have summer visitation for two weeks in the month of June and must notify the custodial parent of the dates by April 30th of each year. If the non-custodial parent fails to give proper and timely notice of his/her intent to

exercise visitation in June, then the non-custodial parent shall have visitation with the minor child(ren) from 6:00 p.m. on June 1 through 6:00 p.m. on June 15.

The non-custodial parent shall have summer visitation for two weeks in the month of July and must notify the custodial parent of the dates by May 30th of each year. If the non-custodial parent fails to give proper and timely notice of his/her intent to exercise visitation in July, then the non-custodial parent shall have visitation with the minor child(ren) from 6:00 p.m. on July 1 through 6:00 p.m. on July 15.

The non-custodial parent shall have summer visitation beginning at 6:00 p.m. on August 1st through 6:00 p.m. on August 7th of each year.

Two weeks shall mean one period of 14 consecutive days or two periods of seven consecutive days with visitation beginning and ending at 6:00 p.m. The non-custodial parent shall not schedule periods of summer visitation consecutively to create period of three consecutive weeks (such as last two weeks of July and first week of August) or a period of four consecutive weeks (such as last two weeks of June and first two weeks of July).

Regular visitation shall resume on the weekend immediately following the first day of school and non-custodial parent shall have visitation on that weekend. Weekends shall thereafter alternate between the parents until the first day of summer visitation.

ALL VISITATIONS

Toys and clothes belong to the child(ren) and should travel freely between households and shall be returned with the child(ren) in a clean and orderly manner.

It is important to be aware that this visitation schedule is for the purpose of providing assured minimum amounts of visitation between the non-custodial parent and the child(ren). Visitation should exceed the number of occasions set out herein. In addition, liberal telephonic communications between the parents and child(ren) are encouraged and shall occur. All such telephonic communications shall be at reasonable times and under reasonable circumstances.

CHANGE OF RESIDENCE

Each parent shall provide the other with his/her current address and telephone number. Further, each parent shall notify the other of a change in his/her address and/or telephone number immediately upon learning of such change, but in any event before such change.

TRANSPORTATION

- A. Transportation Arrangements and Cost if the parties reside within 250 miles from each other: The parties shall share the obligation and responsibility for transporting the child(ren) for the exercise of visitation by the non-custodial parent. Each party may fulfill their share of this obligation by actually transporting the children to or from such visitation. If either parent refuses to contribute his/her share of the transportation (in-kind), the other party shall be entitled to

reimbursement for one-half the actual costs of transportation, not to exceed the state reimbursement rate for mileage for court officials (currently 55 cents per mile).

- B. Transportation Arrangements and Cost if the parties reside more than 250 miles from each other: Each party shall have the right to transport the child(ren) for visitation by either ground or air. At least thirty (30) days prior to a scheduled visitation, the parties are to mutually arrange for the transportation of the child(ren) for the visitation. In the event the parties cannot agree on the mode of transportation, then each party shall have the right to transport the child(ren) by either air or ground. In the event one party elects to fly the child(ren) and the other elects to transport by ground, the party transporting by ground shall bear the responsibility and the total expense of transporting the child(ren) to or from the residence of the other party.

In the event the parties elect to use ground transportation for the scheduled visitation, then the parties are to meet at a halfway point between the residence of the respective parties.

In the event air transportation is chosen by only one party, that party has the responsibility to ensure that young child(ren) are accompanied by a responsible adult or make arrangements with the airline for the supervision of the unaccompanied minor(s). If air transportation is elected by both parties they shall each pay their respective proportionate percentage (based on the child support guidelines) of the ticketed travel expense at the time of the purchase of the airline ticket.

FAILURE TO COMPLY

Failure to comply with the provisions of this Standard Visitation Schedule may result in a modification of custody and/or visitation privileges.
